Connecting Beyond the Walls/ Community Engagement

Life education is as equally important as school education.

In most cases students are able to grasp lesson plan big ideas by actually doing.

Connecting the knowledge that they are learning in their classrooms to the real world is the best way for students to understand why education is important in their daily lives

For example in the social studies curriculum for grade 10 and 11 students, we teach students the importance of citizenship ship, and why it is important to give back. A great idea would be to start the lesson plan in the classroom and walk down the block to a soup kitchen or any volunteer facility with your students, and tie in the importance of giving back.

Experiences like these are ones that will help prepare our students for the real world.
